## Rector's Ramblings – March 2026 (A Season of Perseverance and Grace)

As the last traces of frost (hopefully!) begin to yield to the first green shoots of March, I find myself reflecting on the remarkable display of human spirit we witnessed during the Winter Olympics in Milan and Cortina last month.

There is something profoundly moving about watching athletes navigate the literal and metaphorical "slippery slopes" of life. Whether it was the precision of the skaters or the sheer courage of those hurtling down the Alpine runs, we were reminded that greatness is rarely achieved in a straight line. It is forged through discipline, often in the cold and the dark, and through the resilience to pick oneself up after a fall.

In many ways, the Olympic journey mirrors our own walk through Lent. We are currently in that "middle distance" of the season - a time that can feel a bit like a long-distance cross-country ski trek. The initial enthusiasm of Ash Wednesday may have cooled, and the celebration of Easter still feels a long way off. Yet it is precisely in this quiet, steady perseverance that our faith finds its depth.

This month, our Lenten journey brings us to a joyful "halfway house": Mothering Sunday on 15th March.

Historically, this was the day when domestic servants were given leave to return to their "mother church" and visit their families. Today, it remains a vital moment to pause and say thank you. We celebrate not just our own mothers, but all those who have "mothered" us - the grandmothers, aunts, teachers, and neighbours who have offered us a sanctuary of care.

In a world that often feels as competitive as an Olympic arena, the unconditional love of a mother-figure provides the ultimate "safe harbour."

Looking further ahead, the month draws to a close with the dramatic shift of Palm Sunday on 29th March. (And if any readers have a donkey or two available for a procession around the church – please do get in touch!)

We move from the warmth of family appreciation to the stirring scenes of the Triumphal Entry. As we hold our palm crosses, we recall the crowds in Jerusalem who cheered for Jesus, only to fall silent or turn away just days later. It is a sobering reminder of how quickly "gold medal" acclaim can vanish.

Palm Sunday marks the start of **Holy Week**, the most sacred time in our calendar. I invite you all to walk this path with us. From the shadows of the cross to the light of the empty tomb, it is a journey that promises something far more enduring than any earthly podium: the gift of new life.

May this March be for you a month of steady hope and renewed strength.

# All Saints Church Needs Your Help!

Dear Parishioners,

We have a problem. The church roof is leaking and the walls are, literally, crumbling. The windows and doors do not keep the rain out and, in the case of the door at the top of the tower, it is pulling its pintles out of the wall!

Alright, the church is not going to fall down tomorrow, but if we don't do something about it now, it very soon will!

Ultimately, if we don't make general repairs now, the situation will continue deteriorating so that eventually, repairs will be impractical, unaffordable and the church will close.

No more weddings, no more christenings, no more burials, no more flower festivals, no more Pimms with Hymns, Cream Teas, Christingles, no more carol services, Crib Services, no more services. I could go on.

Last year we went out to tender to contractors to get a quote to fix everything. Just before Christmas we got all the responses. The least expensive was just over £44,000!

Your Parochial Church Council (PCC) has taken on the challenge to raise this amount but it is one helluva lot of money!

We need help from anyone and everyone, however much or little.

Hence this appeal. There are several ways in which you can donate:

1: You can make a one-off donation simply by transferring any amount direct to our Church Fund at any time, using a BACs transfer to the Church bank account, Hundon Parochial Church Council (PCC), account no: 00710777, post code: 30-93-99. Please mark the transfer "Church Roof".

2: Alternatively, if you would rather, just post any amount in an envelope marked, "Church Roof" through the letterbox of a Member of the PCC, names and addresses at the end of this letter. Please put your name on the back of the envelope, or not if you wish to remain anonymous.

3: If you are able to "Gift Aid"\* a donation, there are yellow envelopes, on a little table on the left, just inside the main door into the church. Please place your donation inside, write your name and address on the envelope and post it through the letterbox of any member of the PCC, their names and addresses are at the end of this letter. Or leave the completed envelope in the large collection jar in the church, clearly marked CHURCH ROOF. Donations are cleared daily from the church. Also, there will be Gift Aid envelopes available in the Village Shop from the end of February.

\* Donating through Gift Aid means charities and community amateur sports clubs (CASCs) can claim an extra 25p for every £1 you give.

4: Parish Giving Scheme: If you feel able to give support in the longer term then please consider using the Parish Giving Scheme. Through this scheme you can make a direct debit to the Church on a monthly, quarterly, half yearly or annual basis, and if you are a tax payer, they will claim the Gift Aid back from HMRC which is sent directly to the church account. 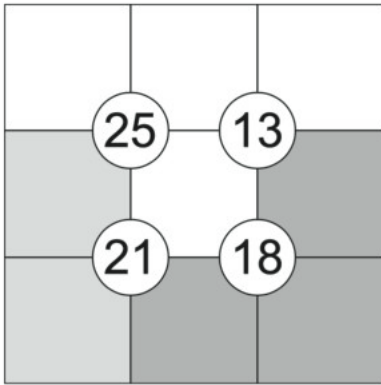

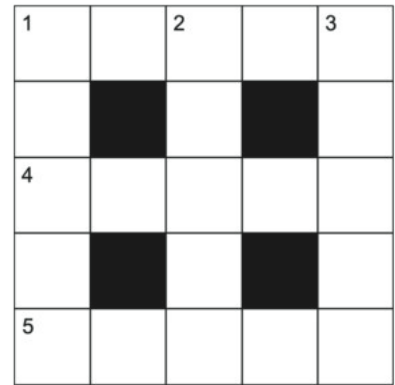

**Woodland Trust Nature Detectives**

**Build a birds' nest**  
Build your own birds' nest - would your eggs be safe?

Could you build a nest strong enough to hold a clutch of eggs and withstand the wind?

You will need:

- Dried grasses
- Twigs
- Sticks
- Fallen leaves
- Old cobwebs

Look for a tree with a fork in one of its lower branches.

Start building your nest. Remember, it needs to keep the eggs - and chicks! - safe. And it mustn't fall apart in the wind.

When you've finished building your nest, place several small stones or cones inside it. Can it take their weight without falling apart?

Give the branch a little shake - are your eggs safe inside the nest?

**For an extra challenge, build it with one hand. Birds only have their beaks, after all!**

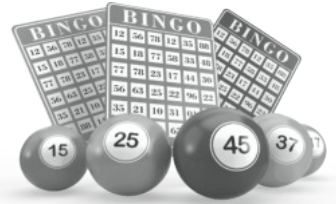

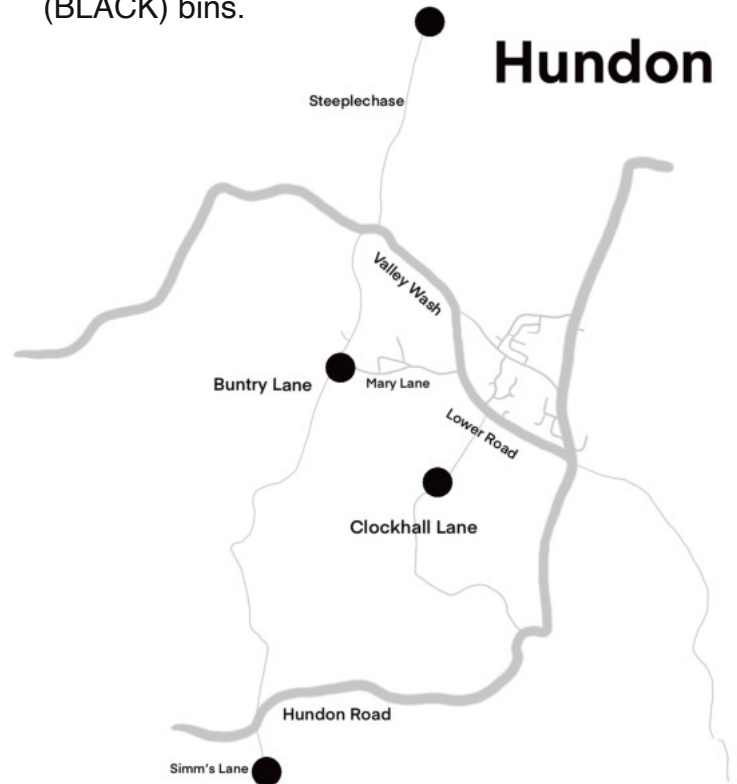
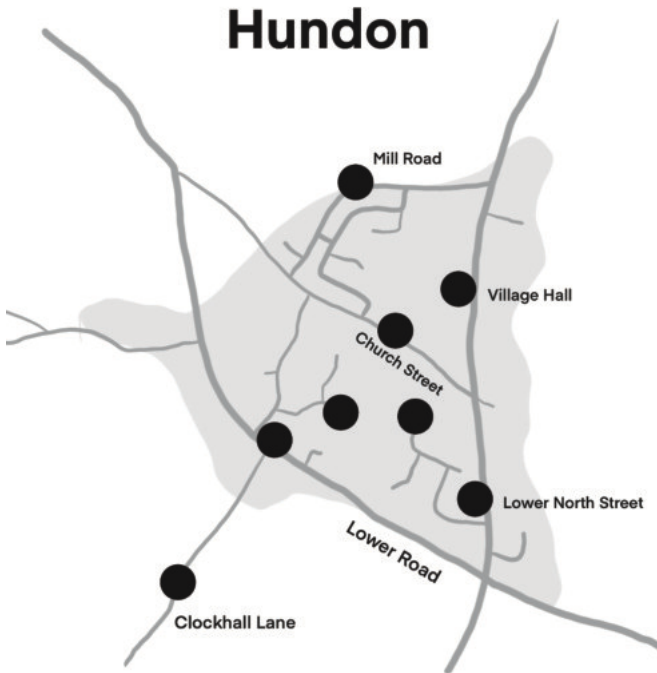

But ended up hooting and howling beside them.

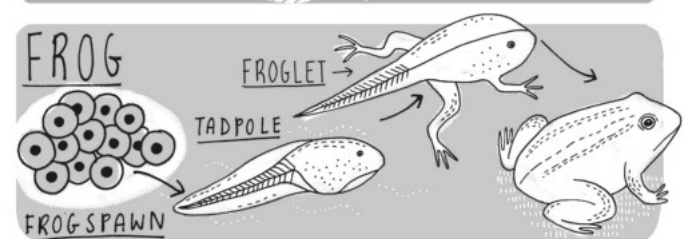
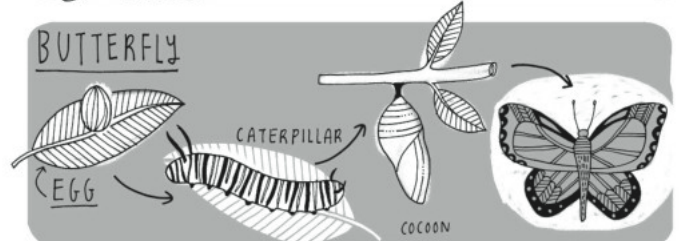
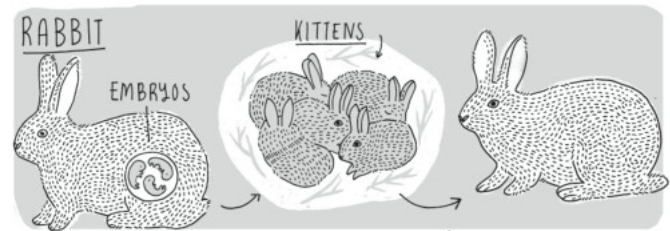
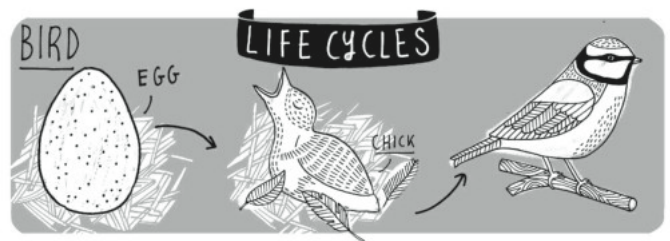
The noise drew a crowd, and an old Chuckaboo
